

Respirator Fit Testing

If you provide care to, or come into close contact with patients with known or suspected [airborne transmissible illness](#), or perform [aerosol-generating medical procedures](#) (AGMPs) resulting in opportunistic airborne transmission, you require an annual respirator fit test.
